

Photogenic Fluids IV: Drops and Tilt Painting

The paintings were created simply by drops of paints and letting them run and mix. The process devised for the paintings is outlined below.

- 1. Deposit drops of paint on a sheet (e.g., card stock, foam board).
- 2. Tilt and hold the sheet; allow the paint to run to desired location.
- 3. Return the sheet to horizontal position for the paint to sufficiently dry.
- 4. Repeat the above steps as needed. Add different paints.
- 5. Drag the paints and mix with pointed objects such as toothpick, knife blade, etc.

Control elements include sheet material, number and amount of paint drops, tilt angle and hold time. I used leftover house paints (interior) but other kinds of paint could be used. Plastic dispensing bottles provide a convenient way to deposit paint, drop by drop.

Future exploration will include two more control elements: blowing air onto the sheet and rotating the sheet to alter the paint streaks. The rotation could be achieved by attaching the sheet to a hand drill or placing it on a turntable, and blowing could be done through a drinking straw or a small PVC pipe. Another possibility is to blast the drops with a large vortex ring.
